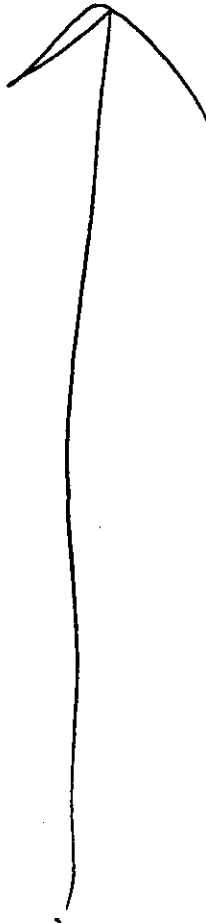

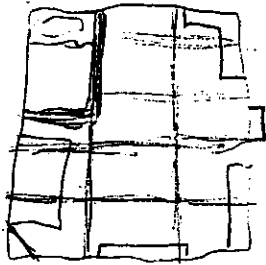

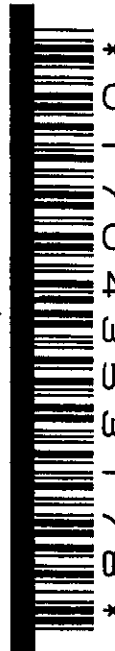

His reaction to Tess's confession is basically out of character but ~~but~~ ~~still~~ still a bit fair. He is in a bad position now. He needs to forgive his wife and be with her. Even though his parents may not approve and he would be looked down upon by society. Tess is somewhat at fault too. She should have told Angel about her previous encounter with Alec. Angel felt a great deal of disappointment in Tess when she told him of her previous affairs with Alec. He felt that he fell in love with a totally different woman, even though he did not. He is being honest to Tess though. He is not hiding his anger and pain. It probably would have been worse for ~~the~~ both Angel and Tess if Angel would have kept his feelings shut inside. It is somewhat expected/predictable of Angel too. He was brought up to believe that he was in a higher class than "cottage girls" and that in almost all cases, women serve the men. The women are supposed to forgive the men for lots of things but men forgiving women for their sins is much less common. So he might be expected by his family (mother, father, and older brothers) to act this way. The double standard theme type deal is used often in this section, a double standard is basically when something is standard for one person ~~or~~ or group of persons, and another standard for a different person ~~or~~ or group of persons. She snaps at her peers when they make fun of her and her father. She is still very young and quite innocent. Her dress, being the pure color of white, implies her innocence and purity (white always symbolizes purity and innocence), like how angels and pictures of heaven are white. She lives in a cottage in a somewhat secluded town, so she doesn't really have many experiences with the world and the problems it contains. She is somewhat sheltered and shielded from mainstream society. She also seems very forgiving and kind hearted. She will probably grow up and be used because of her natural qualities.
- Irony is definitely used a lot in this novel, and one good example is when the Parson calls Dick Durbeyfield "Sir John". Dick Durbeyfield is just walking home one afternoon minding his own business after slacking off all day long and having a few drinks at the local bar when the Parson refers to him as being a descendant of an old noble family. Calling him Sir John when he is acting like a piece of white trash is most extensively ironic. Another example ~~of~~ ^{that} Harper uses is

when Tess goes to Alec O'uberville to claim family kinship Alec O'uberville isn't even a true O'uberville. His father took that name when they moved to the town because he thought it had a good reputation.

So here is Alec appearing to be of a good noble family and all high and mighty when he is really just a traveling man who put on a little more show to fool the locals.
